



FAE Rooms Target

Use this target to create editable Views by combining Room images with artworks from ArtTracker

- 1. **Print the FAE Rooms Target:** This target should measure 6" on each side or 152.4mm. The artwork image is scaled most accurately when printed at this size but this measurement may vary slightly depending on the computer and printer combination used. With some, even if you are printing at 100%, you might have to uncheck the "scale to fit" option.
- 2. Place the target on the wall, right side up, in the approximate center of where you would like a two dimensional artwork to be placed.
- 3. It is important that the target is level* and flat to the wall before you tape the corners down.

 (Post-it notes or painters tape works well and will not mar most wall finishes. To be sure, we recommend that you test your choice in an area that will not show before you use it in a place that does.)

The FAE App will offer you two options in the Upload Rooms mode:

Option 1: Take a Room Photo and Immediately Upload it to FAE, all within the FAE App

- Take a photograph of your room that incorporates the Rooms Target.
- Accept and name the image, and if you have already created one, assign it to a project. (If you have not, you can create and assign a project once the image is in My Rooms.)
- Upload the room image to My Rooms on the FAE site so it can be used to create an editable View.

Option 2: Choose an Existing Room Photo from your camera roll and Upload it through the FAE App

- Choose a room image that incorporates an FAE Rooms Target from your camera roll.
- Accept and name the image, and if you have already created one, assign it to a project. (If you have not, you can create and assign a project once the image is in My Rooms.)
- Upload the room image to My Rooms on the FAE site so it can be used to create an editable View.

For best results, follow these important tips:

- It is very important that both the target and the Camera are level when taking a room image. You can be sure the camera is level by lining up a wall junction, a bookcase edge, or the side of a window just inside the image frame so both vertical lines they create are parallel.
- It is also important that the target is in sharp focus. After you have framed your shot, tap the FAE target where it appears on the screen of your device and a smaller focus box should appear around it. This focuses the camera in on the area of the FAE target. If you see the larger center focus box appear again, focus on the target may have broken and you should re-tap the target to reset it.
- Take multiple images from your preferred position and different locations in the room. As focus and a level camera are important, multiple, carefully shot images are the best way to avoid having to reshoot a space. Shooting from multiple room positions will provide a selection of options and possibly fewer manual perspective adjustments during the process of creating a view.

Creating a Simple Level

- * If a level is not handy, a quick and easy make-shift level can be devised with:
 - 1. A small piece of clear magic tape
 - 2. A 14 inch length of thread
 - 3. A small paper clip, washer, safety pen, or anything that can be used to weight one end of the thread

Tie one end of the thread to the weight. With the target on a flat surface, take a 1 inch length of tape and at the left or right side of the paper near the top, slide it under the back of the paper, sticky side up, so there is about ½ inch of tape protruding. Lay the thread directly alongside the paper so that the weight is slightly below its bottom edge and the sting is captured by the tape, closest to the paper edge. Fold the tape over the string capturing the thread. As you place the target on the wall, you can easily level the target by rotating it back and forth until the string and the side of the paper's edge is parallel.
